Don't Leave Women Exposed—Join ACS CAN

Each year, ACS CAN proves again and again it *is* a public health leader in Illinois when our large network of volunteer advocates press lawmakers to protect cancer prevention funding for a vital safety net program serving Illinois' women. The Illinois Breast & Cervical Cancer Program provides free screening options for uninsured women, and has identified cancer and pre-cancer cases in more than 2,000 women over the last five years.
