Road To Recovery

7.6 Million free rides to treatment have been given to patients since 2005.



Reach To Recovery

1.5 million patients have received one-on-one support from fellow breast cancer survivors since the program began in 1969.



Hope Lodge Communities

267,000 free nights of lodging were provided to patients in 2015.



Patient Navigators

50,000 patients got help understanding their diagnosis and tackling day-to-day issues in 2015.



Look Good, Feel Better

Nearly **1 million** patients have learned to manage appearance-related side effects of treatment since the program began.



Breast Cancer Research

The American Cancer Society is currently funding 160 grants related to breast cancer – totaling more than **\$62 million**.
